

OUR AIMS

Kidsafe advocates on child safety issues, undertakes public awareness campaigns and provides information, training and practical advice, guidance and support to parents and carers, government and non-government agencies, community organisations and individuals.

The Kidsafe mission is 'making a safer world for kids' and we achieve this by:

- raising awareness of unintentional child injury and its consequences,
- identifying causes and risk factors responsible for injury,
- advocating for changes to standards and regulations relating to products and equipment,
- providing organisations and individuals with up to date injury prevention information,
- highlighting the dangers of unsafe products, equipment and child care practices.

WHAT WE DO

Kidsafe NSW has three core project areas.


Home and Community Safety Unit

The importance of child safety within the home cannot be underestimated. Kidsafe NSW has identified a number of potential safety hazards in and around the home including:

- kitchen appliances
- nursery furniture
- children's clothing
- house design and construction
- fall surfaces and structures
- fire hazards and backyard pools
- household furniture and fittings
- play areas and equipment

Kidsafe House, situated in the grounds of the Children's Hospital at Westmead, has been established to look like a typical family home with a lounge/dining area, kitchen, bathroom, nursery, laundry and outdoor play area. Throughout the house, displays and information are provided about childhood hazards and injury prevention strategies in and around the home.

The Child Road Safety Unit

The main issues addressed by the Child Road Safety Unit include pedestrian, passenger, driveway and bicycle safety. The Unit is involved in the development and implementation of media campaigns, resource materials and education and training programs. Child road safety messages are available in a number of languages.

The Playground Advisory Unit (PAU)

The Playground Advisory Unit (PAU) is the principal agency which provides impartial technical, design and safety information services to all groups across NSW.

The Unit aims to increase the number of safe, creative play environments that are aligned with Australian Playground Safety Standards. The PAU also aims to:

- Promote participation in recreational and physical activities
- Promote good quality, best practise playground design
- Encourage best practise playground maintenance and inspection regimes
- Encourage the inclusion of natural features in playspaces
- Demonstrating a holistic approach to playground design and management

The PAU provides playground advisory services to local government, community groups, children's services, schools, parents, industry, health professionals and other government departments and agencies. Services include on-site inspections, review of plans, training workshops and presentations.
